R Line remains essential as region recovers from COVID-19

Like other agencies and jurisdictions, the Regional Transportation District is facing some tough choices on how to address decreases in ridership and revenues due to the pandemic. Yet during the public health crisis, the R Line was among the top three RTD rail lines for retaining riders.

Since the line opened less than four years ago — a \$687 million promise fulfilled from the voter-approved FasTracks plan — transit-reliant residents on the Denver metro area's eastern edge are learning to love the R Line. Before the pandemic creeped into our everyday lives, the R Line experienced a 6.2% ridership increase in 2019 — the highest among RTD's light rail lines.

The R Line remains the most direct connection to the A Line and Denver International Airport for the eastern Denver metro area. It delivers essential workers in the health care industry to major job centers every day. And it serves 108,000 of the Denver region's most vulnerable population, including

low-income individuals, older adults, young people and those living with disabilities.

Since the R Line started moving people in 2017, 5,500 new residences and 800,000 square feet of new commercial space have become available. Even amid the public health crisis, development along the R Line is moving full-steam ahead, with the expectation of bringing new riders to transit-supportive land-use centers like The Point at Nine Mile, Parkside at City Centre and the Fitzsimons Station stop at the Anschutz Medical Campus.

The R Line is the only direct regional connection between the growing northeast Denver metro area and the booming southeast corridor, and it is a critical part of a thriving and equitable public transit system for all as the region works together to recover from COVID-19.
